

## \$500,000 in New Funding

Support the sustainability of inclusive postsecondary education programs in Georgia through Academic Transition Teacher funding.

Increase legislative funding from the existing \$500,000 to \$1,000,000 in total within the Georgia Council on Developmental Disabilities Budget.

- set student's course of study to align with realistic career goals
- modify curricula to integrate universal design for learning across multiple disciplines
- ensure students are ready for real jobs upon graduation
